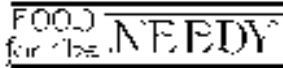

**MASS BOOK FOR 2010!**

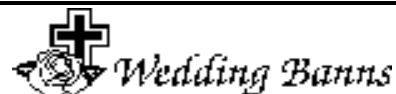

His/ her mother can hear his/her heartbeat now on an ultrasonic stethoscope. His/her milk-teeth buds are present at 6 1/2 weeks. It has been reported that a two-month old baby can suck his/her thumb. From this moment onward, your spiritually adopted baby grows and refines his/her body. But everything he/she needs to survive once he/she is born is already present by the end of the eighth week.
